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Executive Summary

Methodology

The random telephone survey comprised 484 Residents from Maroochy Shire Council. The majority of respondents interviewed were full-time residents of the Maroochy Shire. A total of 44 respondents were interviewed from each of the Maroochy Shire Council's 11 divisions. Age quotas were achieved in accordance with the 2001 Census.

Community Awareness

20% of respondents were aware of the Maroochy 2025 community visioning project. Awareness levels varied from less than 20% and up to 40% across Council Divisions.

Reasons for Living in Maroochy Shire

Jobs, a relaxed healthy lifestyle and the scenic beauty/environment rated highly as the reasons why respondents first chose to live in Maroochy Shire.

Maroochy 2025 Core Value Statements

Respondents generally strongly agreed with the following core value statements:

- Practicing ethics, integrity and respect in personal and public life (79%)
- Fostering community involvement and participation in decisions that affect our Shire (79%)
- Caring and respecting our natural environment (74%)
- Belonging to a fair community will improve our quality of life (67%)
- Valuing our cultural heritage (53%)

Community Perceptions of Living in Maroochy Shire

Top rating strengths and weaknesses provided by respondents are summarised in the table below.

Key Issues Facing Maroochy Shire

The key issues given were:

- managing population growth
- traffic congestion
- development character/building height

When respondents were asked to rate whether Maroochy Shire had become a better place to live since they arrived, worse place or stayed the same, 37% believed Maroochy was better place to live since they arrived. When asked about the future, 41% stated that they believed that Maroochy Shire would be a better place to live.

92% of respondents agreed that Maroochy Shire needed a shared vision to create a better future.

Evaluation of Communities

When respondents were read a list of qualities that people use to judge communities and asked to rate the importance of each quality, most respondents stated that all these qualities were very important to somewhat important. When the same qualities were again read to respondents, performance ratings for Maroochy Shire varied from good to fair. The main divergence between importance and performance was in the area of 'quality of leadership', which was rated as poor.

The top rating qualities and respondent's assessment of these qualities for Maroochy Shire are summarised in the table below:

Policy Options

When respondents were read a set of policy options facing Maroochy Shire, the following four options rated highest:

• Maintain low building heights up to 10 storeys	92%
• Maintain current rate levels	80%
• Provide resources to the community to build civic leadership and partnership	70%
• Make coordinated decisions with our regional neighbours	63%

In addition 'protecting the quality of the natural environment' (61% rating) and 'limiting the population growth' (60% rating) were also high priorities for respondents.

Future Community Expectations

In order to meet future community expectations, respondents nominated that Maroochy Shire will need to:

- Control/manage growth
- Improve leadership and wise decision making
- Protect and sustain our natural environment
- Improve public transport and mobility

Introduction

Market Facts was commissioned to conduct a telephone survey of 484 residents from Maroochy Shire Council to ascertain community opinion on a range of issues affecting the future of Maroochy Shire. The outcomes of the survey will inform the Maroochy 2025 project team and provide baseline data to measure community perceptions of issues facing the Maroochy Shire.

Maroochy 2025 is an initiative of the Maroochy Shire Council aimed at facilitating a collective community vision for Maroochy Shire that articulates a preferred future in 2025. Extensive public participation is being used to develop the vision. The project will produce a preferred futures scenario with the community of the Maroochy Shire and other relevant stakeholders, based on the “Oregon Model”.

As stated in the ‘Maroochy 2025 Project Management Plan’ the objectives of the project are to:

- *Engage the Community in the decision making process*
- *Work collaboratively to determine probable future scenario*
- *Work collaboratively to determine preferred future scenario*
- *Agree a future scenario*
- *Develop Action plans & processes to facilitate the delivery of the agreed future scenario*
- *Transparent process via communication & community involvement*
- *Cross boundaries & jurisdiction input*
- *Assess the impact of community engagement with its participants.*

Research Methodology

The random telephone survey comprised 484 Residents from Maroochy Shire Council. The majority of respondents interviewed were full-time residents of the Maroochy Shire. Less than 1% of the total sample were part-time residents but nominated Maroochy Shire as their primary residence.

A total of 44 respondents were interviewed from each of Maroochy Shire Council's 11 divisions.

The following age quotas were achieved:

A total of 2511 telephone numbers were attempted with 1600 connected calls being made to achieve the 484 completed surveys.

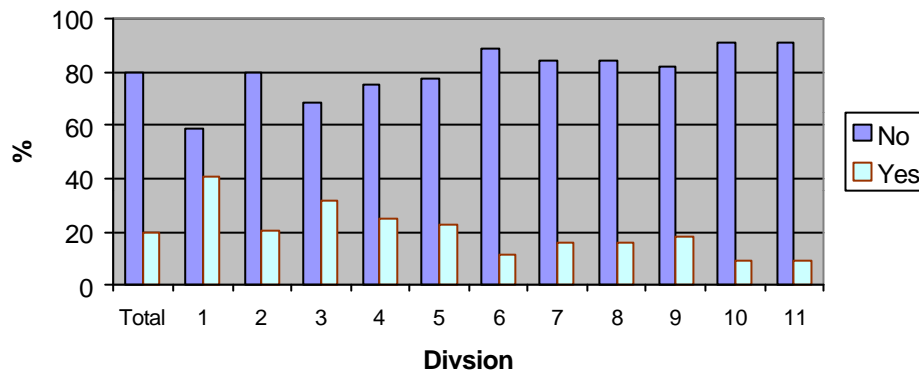
Research Report Findings

Community Awareness of Maroochy 2025 Community Visioning Project (Tables 1 & 2)

Respondents were asked whether they had heard about the Maroochy 2025 community-visioning project.

- For the total sample area 20% of respondents were aware of the Maroochy 2025 community visioning project.
- In the 18-24 age group only 7% of respondents were aware of the project.
- *Figure 1* below shows the community awareness levels by Council division. In division 1, 41% of respondents were aware of the project. In comparison, only 9% of respondents were aware of the project in divisions 10 and 11.

Length of Time Living in Maroochy Shire (Table 3)

Respondents were asked how long they had been living in the Maroochy Shire area.

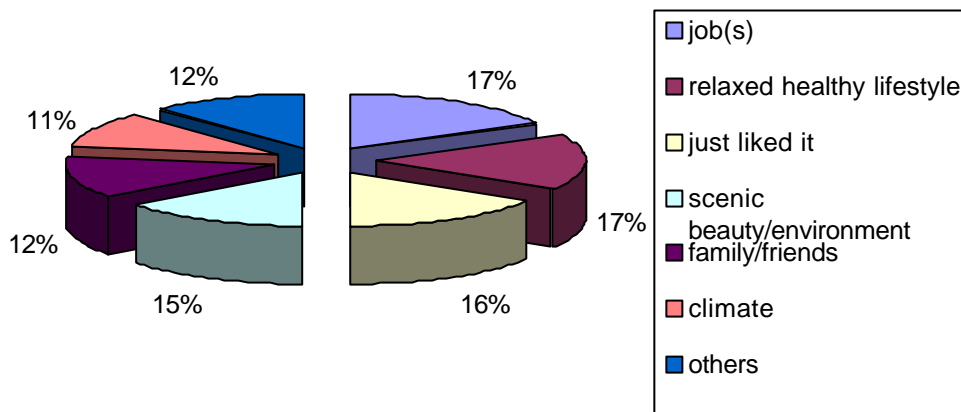
- 17% of respondents have been living in Maroochy Shire for between 5 and 9 years.
- 23% of respondents have been living in Maroochy Shire for between 10 and 15 years.
- 26% of respondents have been living in Maroochy Shire between 16 and 20 years.
- 8% of respondents had lived in Maroochy Shire all their life.

Reasons for Choosing Maroochy Shire (Tables 4 & 5)

Respondents were asked (unprompted) the reasons for first choosing to live in the area.

- The top six responses are summarised in *Figure 2* below.

Figure 2: Reasons for choosing to live in Maroochy Shire



- In the 18-24 and 25-34 age group a total of 43% of respondents had moved to Maroochy Shire with their parents.
- 21% of respondents in the 45-54 age group, had moved to Maroochy Shire for the scenic beauty/environment. In addition, 21% of respondents in the 55-64 age group had also moved to Maroochy Shire for the scenic beauty/environment.
- 12% of respondents in the 65 years and over age group had moved to Maroochy Shire for their retirement.
- 22% of respondents living on the coastal urban strip stated that they had moved to the Maroochy Shire because they 'just liked it'.
- In the rural hinterland, 19% of respondents moved to these areas of Maroochy Shire for the 'relaxed healthy lifestyle'. In addition, just over 5% of respondents also moved to these areas for 'acreage living' and 'price/affordability'.
- For respondents living in the semi-rural, in between areas, 23% state 'jobs' as the key reason for moving to Maroochy Shire.

Core Value Statements (Tables 6-10)

Respondents were asked to rate (from 1 to 5) the extent to which they agreed with the core value statements developed by the Sunshine Coast community in the 'Dare to Dream Project'.

The rating scale used was:

1 = strongly agree

2 = somewhat agree

3 = somewhat disagree

4 = strongly disagree

5 = don't know/refused

a) Caring and respecting our natural environment

- 74% of respondents strongly agreed with this core value statement. This trend was similar for males and females and also reflected across all age groups.

b) Valuing our cultural heritage

- 53% of respondents strongly agreed with this core value statement. 61% of females also strongly agreed.
- 40% of males somewhat agreed with this core value statement.

c) Practicing ethics, integrity and respect in personal and public life

- 79% of respondents strongly agreed with this core value statement.
- This trend was consistent across all age group brackets. However, 86% of respondents aged 65 years and over also strongly agreed with this core value statement.

d) Fostering community involvement and participation in decisions that affect our Shire

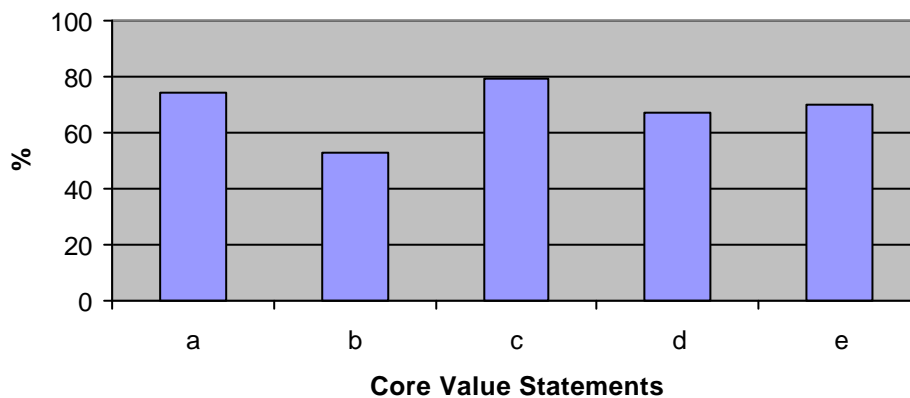
- 79% of respondents strongly agreed with this core value statement.
- Again, this trend was consistent across all age group brackets. However, 86% of respondents aged 65 years and over also strongly agreed with this core value statement.

e) Belonging to a fair community will improve our quality of life

- 67% of respondents strongly agreed with this core value statement. 60% of males and 74% of females strongly agreed with this core value statement.
- 30% of males somewhat agreed with this core value statement
- 12% of respondents in the age between 25-34 years somewhat disagreed with this core value statement.
- 14% of respondents aged between 35-44 years also somewhat disagreed with this core value statement.

Figure 3 below provides a comparison of the percentages of respondents who strongly agreed with the core value statements.

Figure 3: Maroochy 2025 Core Value Statements - % Strongly Agree

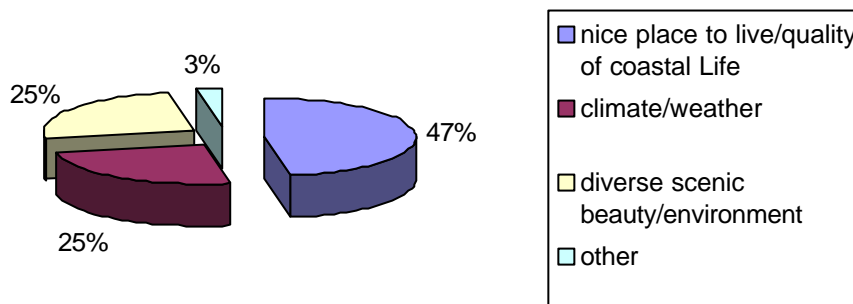


Community Perceptions of Living in Maroochy Shire (Tables 11-14)

Respondents were first asked what they thought was the greatest strength of Maroochy as a place to live.

- The top three responses are summarised in Figure 4.

Figure 4: Maroochy's greatest strength as a place to live

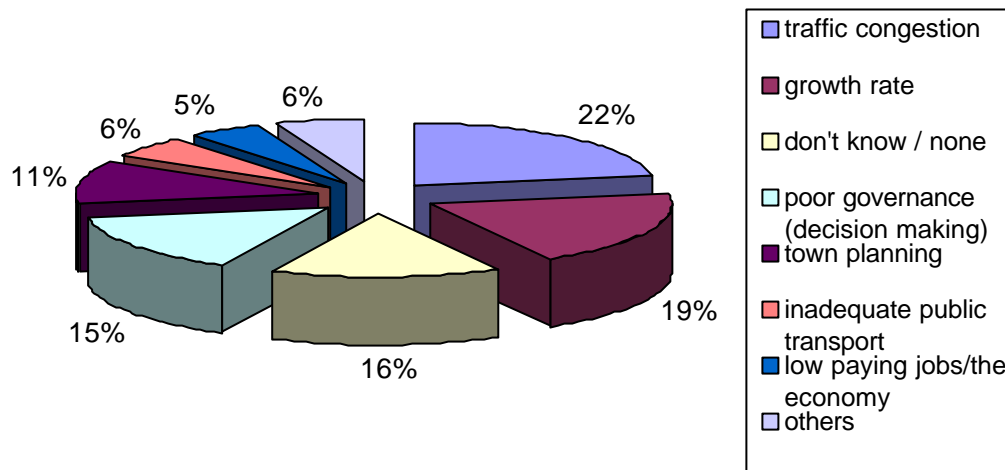


- In the 25-34 age group, 68% of respondents nominated 'nice place to live/quality of coastal life' as Maroochy's greatest strength.
- 34% of respondents in the 35-44 age group, nominated 'diverse scenic beauty/environment'
- 2.3% of respondents in the 18-24 age group, nominated 'availability of jobs' as Maroochy's greatest strength.
- Nearly half of all respondents interviewed in Divisions 1,2 and 6 nominated 'scenic beauty/environment' as Maroochy's greatest strength.
- Over 60% of respondents interviewed in Divisions 2 and 7 nominated a 'nice place to live/quality of coastal life' as Maroochy's greatest strength.

Respondents were then asked for Maroochy's greatest weakness as a place to live.

- The top seven responses are summarised in *Figure 5*.

Figure 5: Maroochy's greatest weakness as a place to live



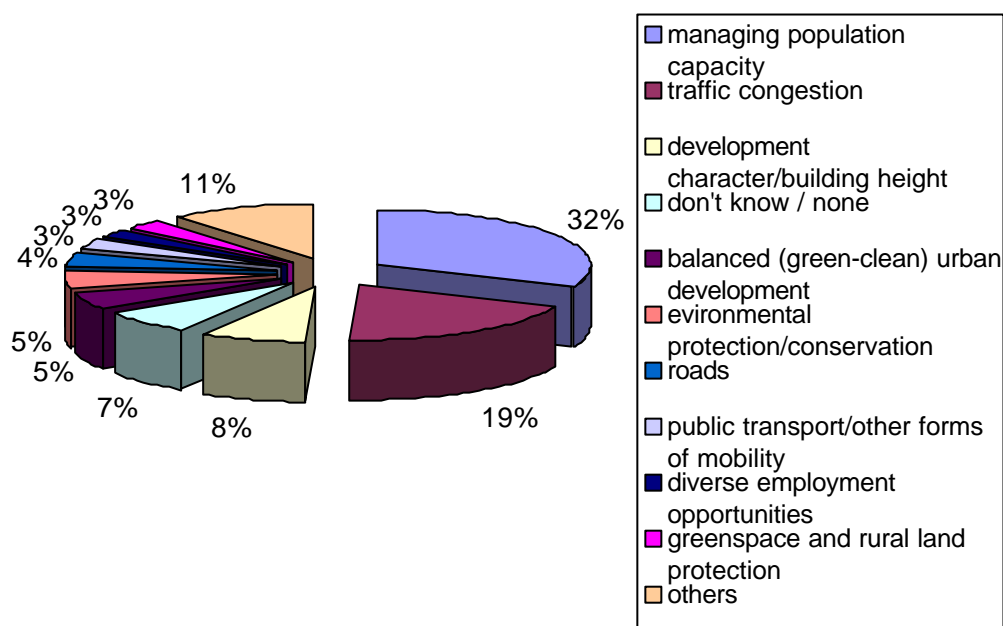
- For respondents in the 18-24 year age group 'traffic congestion' (33%) and 'inadequate public transport' (12%) were nominated as Maroochy's greatest weaknesses.
- 11% of respondents aged between 25-34 years nominated 'low paying jobs/economy' as Maroochy's greatest weakness.
- For respondents in the 35-44 age group, 'growth rate' (28%) and 'inadequate community planning' (9%) were nominated as Maroochy's greatest weakness as a place to live.
- 23% of respondents in the 55-64 age group stated poor governance (decision making) as Maroochy's greatest weakness as a place to live.
- 5% of respondents aged 65 years and over stated 'high Council rates/taxes' as Maroochy's greatest weakness as a place to live.
- In Divisions 10 and 11, 34% and 55% of respondents respectively, stated 'traffic congestion' as Maroochy's greatest weakness.
- 'Growth rates' were mentioned as Maroochy's greatest weakness in Division 7 (39%) and Division 10 (41%).
- In Division 1 'poor governance (decision making)' (27%) and 'inadequate public transport' (18%) were nominated as the greatest weaknesses.

Key Issues Facing Maroochy Shire (Tables 15 & 16)

Respondents were asked what they thought was the most important issue facing Maroochy Shire.

- The top ten responses are summarised in *Figure 6*.

Figure 6: Most Important Issues facing the Maroochy Shire

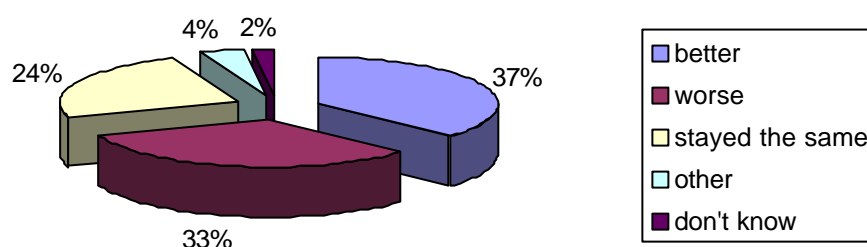


- 41% of respondents aged between 45-54 years stated 'managing population capacity' as the most important issue facing Maroochy Shire.
- 35% of respondents aged between 18-24 years of age stated traffic congestion as the most important issue facing Maroochy Shire
- 'Managing population capacity' was stated as the most important issue facing Maroochy Shire in Division 6 (48%) and Division 10 (61%).
- In Division 11, 64% of respondents stated 'traffic congestion' as the most important issue facing the shire.
- 'Development character/building height limits' was stated as the most important issue in Division 2 (27%) and Division 7 (46%).

Ratings of Maroochy Shire as a Place to Live (Tables 17- 20)

Respondents were first asked to rate whether Maroochy Shire had become a better place to live, worse place or stayed the same.

The key positive reasons given by respondents for their rating were:

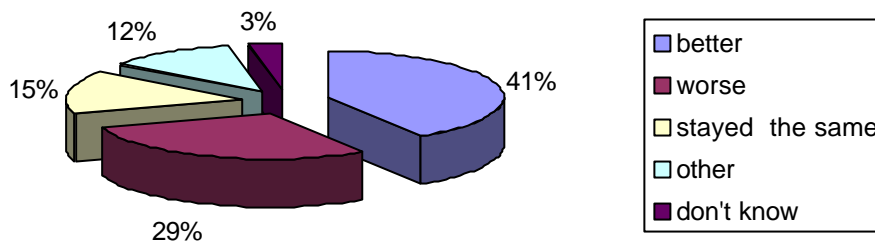
- that 'facilities were being upgraded' (39%); and
- a perception that the Shire was generally 'developing well' (31%)

Reason given by respondents for a negative rating or perception that the Shire was in a worse place than when they first moved there were:

- over population (30%);
- too much growth (30%);
- traffic congestion (20%); and
- the need for more shopping facilities (8%)

They were then asked to use the same ratings about the future Maroochy Shire area.

The key positive reasons given by respondents for their rating were:

- 'progress in area good' (33%);
- 'new facilities being built' (24%); and
- 'good leadership' (6%).

Negative reasons stated by respondents were:

- 'allowing too much development' (41%); and
- 'traffic congestion' (28%).

Need for a Community Vision (Table 21)

Respondents were asked whether they thought Maroochy Shire needed a shared vision to create a better future.

- 92% of respondents agreed that Maroochy Shire needed a shared vision.

Evaluation of Communities (Tables 22 & 23)

Personal Rating:

Respondents were read a list of qualities that people use to judge communities and asked to rate the importance of each quality

The following rating scaled was used:

- *very important*
- *somewhat important*
- *somewhat unimportant*
- *very unimportant*

Rating for Maroochy Shire:

The same qualities were again read to respondents and they were asked to rate Maroochy Shire.

The following rating scale was used:

- *excellent*
- *good*
- *fair*
- *poor*

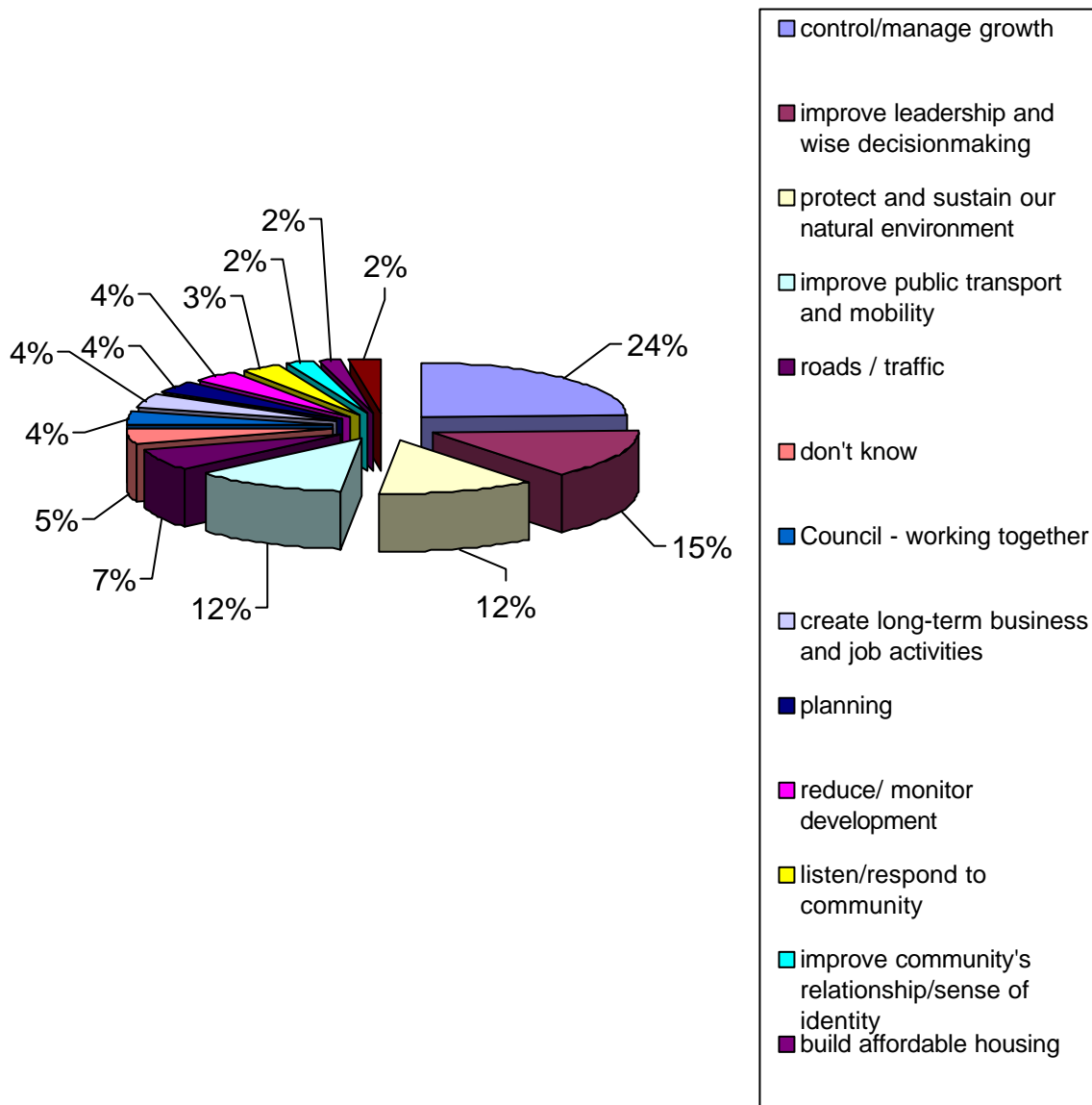

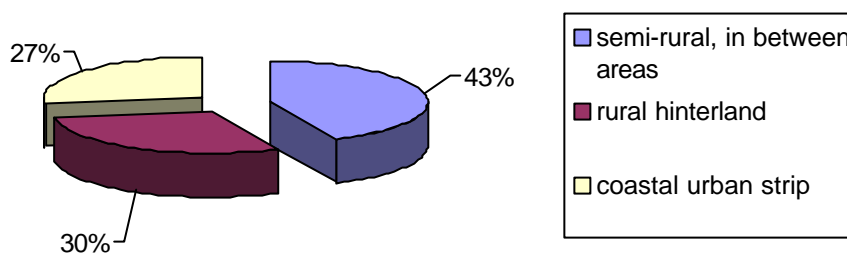
Figure 9: Meeting Future Expectations - Key Respondent Issues

The following descriptions relate to the total sample area.

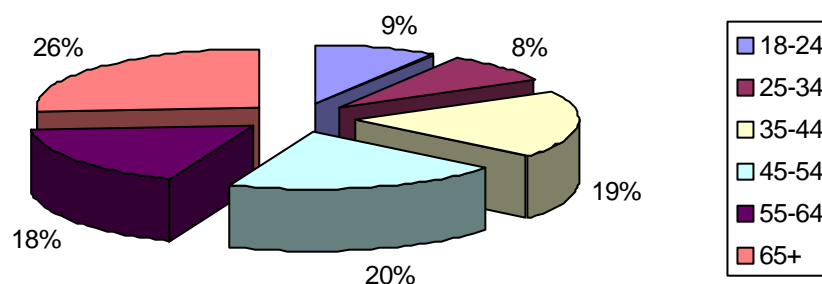
Gender

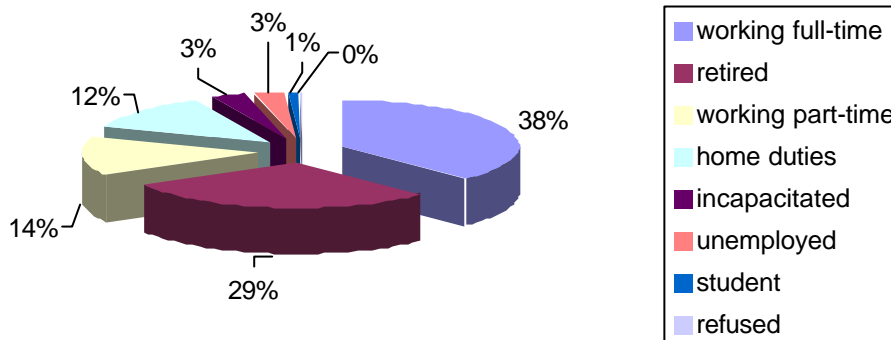
Figure 11: Respondent Profile - Age Group

- The age group of respondents interviewed is summarised in *Figure 11*.

- In the 25-34, 45-44 and 45-54 over 55% of respondents were working full-time.

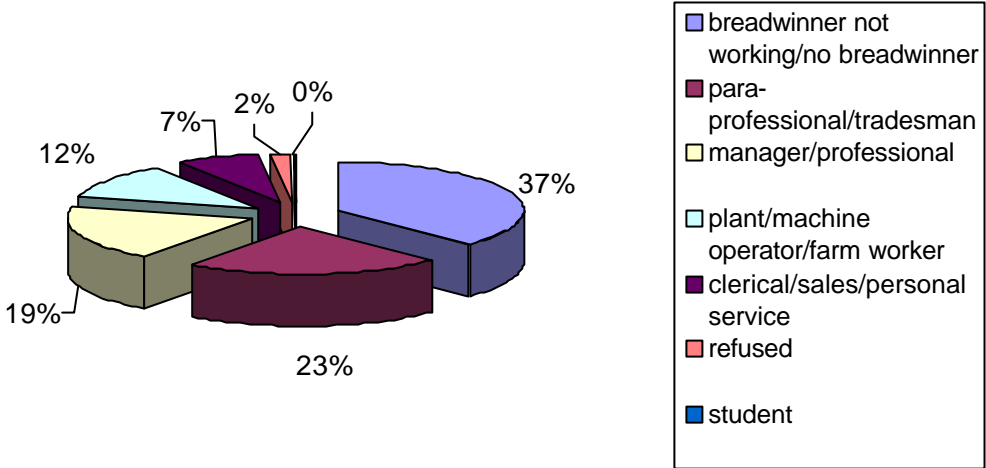
Home ownership

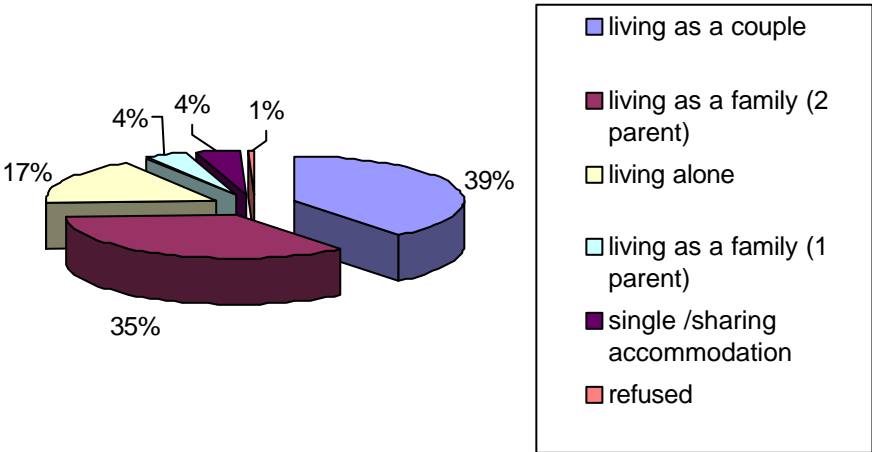
Figure 13: Respondent Profile- Occupation of Main Breadwinner

- The occupation of the main breadwinner of respondents interviewed is summarised in *Figure 13*.

Psychographic Analysis of Respondents (Tables 34 - 36)

Respondents were then asked a series of psychographic questions.

When asked what they relied on in life:

- 63% relied on the power of self.
- 20% relied on the strength of a group.
- Almost 70% of males relied on the power of self.

When asked what they preferred in society:

- 48% stated comprehensive rules and regulations.
- 36% stated minimal rules and regulations.
- In the 65 years and over age group 60% stated comprehensive rules and regulation.

When asked in life where they sensed they were:

- 46% stated they were surviving.
- 28% stated they were enterprising.
- In the 18-24 age group 61% stated they were surviving.
- In the 45-54 age group, 49% stated they were enterprising.
- In the 65 years and over, 62% stated they were surviving.

Community Participation in the Maroochy 2025 Project (Tables 37&38)

- 47% of respondents said that they would be keen to participate in the community visioning process to help the future of Maroochy Shire.
- 66% of respondents stated they would be prepared to be questioned again in May 2004 about their responses to the Maroochy 2025 vision.
